

They visited the American Hotel Academy, where they explored career paths in the industry—from studying at the Academy to becoming a General Manager of a hotel or restaurant chain. It was an inspiring tour around the academy, and it was interesting to see how the study area is organized – with real kitchens and even a bar, where hospitality experts give masterclasses.

During their visit to the 5-star Swissôtel Poiana Braşov, campers met the General Manager, who shared her inspiring journey from starting at a reception desk to leading the only 5-star hotel in the Braşov area. As a teacher at the Hospitality Academy, she told an interesting story about her career and provided valuable insights into career opportunities.

They took a cable car ride up Mount Sinai, marveling at snowy landscapes, and explored the stunning Valea Cetății cave. They also enjoyed the charming old city centres of Brașov and Sinaia. A highlight was Dino Park Râșnov, home to 120 life-sized dinosaur replicas based on the latest paleontological discoveries. Despite their busy days, the campers still had energy for skating at the open-air rink!

Olesia Mandra, a member of the camp organizing team, highlighted, "During this great week, we've heard from the teenagers that their biggest dream is to see each other as soon as possible or turn back the clock to the beginning of this amazing week. It seems like a short life path full of dreams that came true, challenges that made them stronger, and insights that helped them to understand themselves. They are definitely not only the friends but after spending this time together—they have become like a family."
